Steward, 62, also is part of the ownership group of the St. Louis Blues and serves on the board of curators of the University of Missouri.

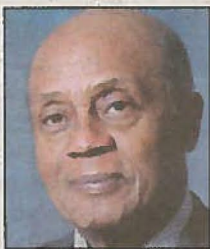

board member for the Radio Arts Foundation and the St. Louis Fire Department Lifesaving Foundation.

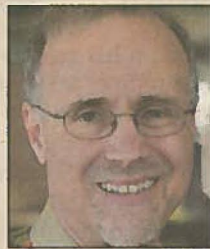
Wilkinson gives to all of the organizations where she is a board member. "You have to be willing to
